Great to hear from you, and glad to know that the Waverley (and you) are still steaming strong!

Thanks for the reply, but I'd already replaced the provisional text by the 'live' version! I also removed the '11' from the name - too great a possibility of confusion with 'll' I thought. And of course almost everyone told me that it worked under IE, though probably not everyone has been thorough enough to apply the patches. One brave soul used Opera, another Netscape, and that was about it. With this sort of market coverage, it's getting hard to defend a W3C standard over a de facto MS one... I don't know anything Compuserve, but for some reason I thought you'd have to use proprietary/non-standard software.

I tend to use the web space for disjoint things, and to keep them all disconnected I just put them into separate folders, so I need to put something at the top-level to stop inquisitive souls like you (and me, for I do it to other people) getting a listing of the folders! Putting an email address there isn't very sensible of course .. but I'm now so much better informed about various sexual perversions than I used to be!

Despite this (alleged) show of efficiency on my part, I now think it might be even longer before I manage to sell the place. So far I've had no-one come to see it!
